

1. Ted Spence Biographical Info

* Ted Spence has been a member of the Executive Committee since soon after the establishment of the CEWF and is a member of the boards of the Cavendish Community Ratepayers Association and of the Catchacoma Cottagers Association. He and his wife Susan have been cottagers on Catchacoma Lake which is part of the Mississauga Lake chain, the largest single reservoir on the TSW, for the past 16 years. They also have family members with lake front property on Little Bob Lake. Ted recently completed seven years as a member of the board of the Federation of Ontario Cottagers' Associations (FOCA) including two years as president. In that role, he maintained active liaison between CEWF and FOCA. Ted retired in 2009 as Professor Emeritus after a 39 year career at York University, which included a 10 year term as Dean of the Faculty of Environmental Studies and 10 years as Senior Policy Advisor to the University President. His academic focus was in environmental planning and hydrology.
