






Natural Shorelines

- <u>Direct</u> relationship to lake health
- 80-90% of all lake life
- Minimum = 75% lake back 30 metres
- Habitat
 - Benthics (bottom dwelling invertebrates that are a key indicator of lake health & an important fish food They respond quickly to changes in water quality)
 - Fish
 - Frogs, butterflies etc.
- Filtering pollutants



 - Each lake assoc can set goals & measure progress




What – The Basic Steps

- Training & Hiring
- Resources
 - Equipment \$3,000.
 - Boats & drivers
 - Accommodation etc.
 - **-**\$
 - Parcel Mapping Data
- Letter to each property owner
 - Info

- From boat evaluation
 - Tied to parcel mapping data
 - Analyze substrate, lot from water back 30 metres or setback, docks, decks & walkways
 - Document with Pictures
 - 40-50 properties per day per evaluator plus data entry



The Evaluators 2016



- Min 3 years ES
- 10 day training course
- Intense Interview

Process



What – the basic steps cont.

- Privacy is paramount
 - No one gets individual info except the property owner
- Information not regulation
- End Result
 - Individual reports
 - Each property owner gets a unique code to access
 - Personalized Rating and Suggestions
 - Lake wide report to Assoc. and C.H.A.

Success to date

- One of 12 regional partners in Canada (8%)
- Over 10,000 properties evaluated
- TY alone 4681 almost 50 % of Canada total
- Flagship for Canada
 - Numbers
 - Managing
 - Innovations & Improvements



Will People Take Action

- Survey on Boshkung and Halls Hawk TY
- Over 30% response rate on Boshkung Results
- 95% awareness
- 98% believe in Natural Shorelines
- 86% had already taken or planning some actions
