Music In The Park 2023 - Bigger Than Ever

Oh, music! The soothing, inspiring, healing panacea that we all love to listen to, watch being performed, dance to, and dream to. And thanks to the Rotary Club of Haliburton and their local sponsors, this year's Music in the Park (MIP) series is going to be bigger than ever. And you're invited!

Due to its popularity, this year we've expanded Music in the Park from eight to 10 weeks," Ursula Devolin, Haliburton Rotary President said. "We've also changed the live performance start time to 6:30 p.m. Mosquitos become more active after sunset, so we decided to move it ahead a bit so people can get home before the bugs start chewing their legs."

"It's a fun night out for the whole family," Steve Roberts, Chairperson said, "including your dog on a leash."

So, which came first, the Rotary Band Shell at Head Lake Park or the Music in the Park Tuesday evening series?

Roberts explained: "Once the Rotary Band Shell was complete in 2014, the Dysart Cultural Resource Committee approached the club and asked if we would consider doing a music series in the park. It ran for six years until COVID hit. Then we lost two years, 2020 and 2021 when performing in the park was not allowed, and it ran again last summer. This year it's grown to ten live performances over ten weeks."

Beginning on June 27, The Ya Babys will take the stage. Then,





Kids show - Starting at 5:30 p.m., kids of all ages will howl with laughter at the comic brilliance of internationally renowned stunt ventriloquist, Tim Holland. Entertaining audiences over two decades in Canada, the U.S., Europe, Asia, and Australia, Holland has shared venues with Splash and Boots, Sharon & Bram, Fred Penner and Martin Short. You will see puppetry, juggling, and a high unicycle. Holland has been quoted as saying: "I've worked hard to make a show that pleases a huge range of audience, not just young to old, but those you love Big Visual Tricks, to those who pride themselves on catching the more subtle humour."

BBQ Beef on a Bun - Rotary's ever-popular BBQ Beef on a Bun is yours to enjoy.

Featured musical artist – One of Haliburton's most popular musical artists, Jeff Moulton, performs at 7 p.m.

Car draw - Then, drum roll ... this year's 2023 Car Draw takes place, only this year it's not a car, it's a truck. The 2022 Chevrolet Colorado 4WD Crew Cab valued at \$43,505 (HST incl.), or the winner can choose \$33,000 cash. Only 800 tickets printed. \$20 each – 3 for \$50; 7 for \$100; or the popular 15 for \$200.

Proceeds from previous car draws have gone toward building the Rotary Park Band Shell, helping fund the community washroom project at the Welcome Centre, the community Christmas party, plus a variety of programs that benefit the community.


"This year, we're hoping that we can put it toward a park improvement project," Devolin said.

Disc Golf at Abbey Gardens

Read all about it!

Did you know that there are over 14,000 Disc Golf courses around the world? That it's a billion-dollar industry in Canada? And, that this trendy sport boasts some professional Disc Golf players who hold million-dollar contracts? So, what is Disc Golf? How is it played? And, why is Abbey Gardens (AG) the primo place to play it in Haliburton?

"Disc golf has been an amazing addition to the property," Ashley McAllister, Director of Operations at AG said. "It has allowed us to develop a trail that explores an area of the property we didn't have access to previously, and has brought hundreds of players to Abbey Gardens who come to try the new course, including players from as far as the UK!"

Darrell Bankes, the Disc Golf Course Designer and Manager at AG, said, "Disc Golf opened July 1, 2021, so this is our third summer. There have been between five to seven thousand rounds that have been played here since we opened."

Originally called Frisbee Golf, Disc Golf started in the 70s. Today, there are thousands of courses across North America. "We host events all the time," Bankes said. "We'll have 70 people show up for a disc golf tournament, just as they would for a ball golf tournament."

Principles of Disc Golf

If you are new to the sport, the principles of disc golf are the

same as regular ball golf, only instead of clubs to hit a ball, you throw plastic discs that are designed specifically for the game that you try to land in a chain-lined basket.

"Lots of juniors play," Bankes said. "It's really fun for kids. It's very much like a frisbee throw. Even the weakest thrower can move up from the tee toward the basket in a number of strokes. It's not like in ball golf where someone might keep missing the ball and hit the dirt."

AG's appealing short course/long course design

Abbey Gardens' 18-hole tract features distinct short-course and long-toss-loving layouts to satisfy all caliber of disc golf players. Each hole has either two baskets and one tee area or two tee-off pads and one basket, so you can create new course options with every visit. The course design perfectly showcases AG's varied landscape and natural features. If you played all eighteen holes, you'd probably walk the loop two miles in total.

You can get your play started in the Pit, a former quarry, before climbing up into a hardwood forest where you're challenged to shape your shot-making. It opens back up into an abandoned meadow, past an 18th century log chute and then dives back into the woods before ending up in the Pit where you can get in some power throws.

Snowshoes, anyone?

Abbey Gardens' DG course is open year-round which is great for people who enjoy playing in the dead of winter. "Because it's a throwing game," Bankes said, "it's okay if there's snow on the ground. You just pick your disc up, brush it off, and throw it again. The problem is, if the snow is two feet deep, it's difficult to walk. And, also, your disc cuts into the snow. They're shaped like a dinner plate and would just knife into the snow and disappear. That's part of the fun of playing in the winter. You don't take it quite as seriously. It's a good excuse to go out for a two-hour walk, especially in Haliburton, where the snow gets to be twelve and eighteen inches deep."

About the discs

Each disc, which is made of plastic and weighs approximately half a pound, has the same range of clubs that you have when you play ball golf. "You have a putter, a pitching wedge, a five iron, a seven iron, a nine iron," Bankes said, "so, there are also different discs that are engineered differently. Innova Disc Golf, the largest manufacturer of disc golf equipment in the world, makes about 120 different discs. Most players who play at Abbey Gardens carry about nine different discs. Even the most novice beginners will bring their own equipment."

DG courtesy

According to Bankes, "Everyone who plays a lot puts their



name and contact information on each disc. So, in case a disc is lost and someone finds it, they have the courtesy to take a photo of it, send it to the owner, and leave it at the AG hub for pickup."

Cost to play & disc rentals

Each adult must purchase a day pass to play the course. Disc rentals are available at the AG Food Hub. Course fees include one free disc rental per player. Additional discs can be rented for a fee of \$5. Also, discs are for sale at the Food Hub. Youth 12 and under are free with a playing adult. Maximum four players (one adult, three youth max). Additional youth players must purchase a Youth Day Pass - available at: abbeygardens.ca/product/ discgolf-child.

Upcoming tournament

On Saturday, July 8, the Triple-Double North Disc Tournament takes place at Abbey Gardens. \$70 entry fee per team includes a player's pack/gift bag and a free disc. "It's a double's tournament," Bankes said. "There are two players who will play the course twice in one day – morning (then lunch), and in the afternoon It's a fun amateur competition with 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place medals."



Highlands Opera Studio, based in Haliburton, was established in 2007 by internationally acclaimed Canadian tenor Richard Margison, O.C., and Canadian professional violist/stage director and former Metropolitan Opera stage director, Valerie Kuinka, as an advanced professional training program and performing arts organization supporting young, highly qualified, opera professionals from across Canada and beyond. During the intensive 5-week summer program, HOS provides highly specialized coaching, international professional networking opportunities through visiting opera professionals (vocal teachers/coaches, conductors, directors, agents, etc.), and performance experience through concerts, public masterclasses, and multiple fully-staged operas with the goal of creating an increase in process skills and employment opportunities.

The 5-week summer intensive including accommodation and meals is offered FREE OF CHARGE to 15-20 highly-accomplished young Canadian opera professionals, aged 19-35, chosen through an annual cross-Canada competitive audition process. The cost of supporting each participant is approximately \$15,000 per person for the full 5 week period. Daily activities include 6 hours of highly specialized industry training 6 days a week, including private coaching, masterclasses, professional auditions/employment opportunities, seminars on related topics, and staging/music rehearsals.

Maintaining relevance in the ever-changing professional operatic world involves making space for everyone to be heard and represented. Opera is a fluid and evolving art form that must reflect the stories of today as well as yesterday. In 2023, in addition to supporting young professional singers. pianists, and production personnel, Highlands Opera Studio has established a new EMERGING COMPOSER RESIDENCY and will host and support one emerging professional Canadian composer-in-residence during the summer program who is working on creating new operas, telling the stories of today. This position is filled through annual application/audition process.

The Highlands Opera Community School was established

in 2011, through which Haliburton County residents can participate in year round education and social activities including online Pay-What-You-Can Singing Lessons (all styles) and the Highlands Opera Youth/Young Adult OperaClub. For six decades Haliburton Art and Craft Festival has been one of summer's constants for cottagers, year-round residents and generations of Haliburton Highlands visitors. Just before the fourth weekend in July, as if by magic, 100 white canopies pop up in the park overnight and by noon Friday when the "gates" open, and the transformation from greenspace to bustling art and craft marketplace is complete. For the next three days Head Lake Park is alive with creative vibes!

Anticipation is high in 2023 for some awesome additions to the Festival including a lively afternoon performance by Juno nominated Beny Esguerra and New Tradition Music, a Journal-Making Drop-In and, best of all, several fresh new artists for you to meet! You can start to see the program roll out right now thanks to social media, a super fun way to check out who's coming and what's on, and plan your Festival weekend. 

"newbies" sprinkled about in every category. Rails End Gallery and Arts Centre puts out a call for entry during the winter and selected participants based on creativity and innovation, demonstrated skill and craftsmanship, overall impression and uniqueness or identity of design. The result is an eclectic mix that is far greater than the "sum of its parts". Come see for yourself July 21, 22 and 23.

Meet the Broken Blacksmith; a metal sculptor and grad of the Haliburton School of Art + Design named Dusty Hutchings. Dusty is on an artistic mission to shed light on world deforestation, one branch or blossom at a time. With the strength of metal, the sculptor draws our attention to nature's fragility with great tenderness and empathy. His 14 foot Cherry Blossom Tree will be on display at the festival for all to see.

Another sculptor to visit with is Zimbabwean-Canadian stone sculptor Chaka Chikodzi. His work is a meditation on geological time and his lifelong relationship to the unique volcanic stone he uses. "The stone tells a history and story of its own. I am interested in the tension between the stone's own sense of time and the story I am trying to tell with it." Chaka creates bold outdoor sculptures and is the subject of a new documentary film *Artists*





at Agnes (Agnes Etherington Art Centre), in which he reflects on his philosophy and experience as an African-Canadian artist living in Ontario.

Fibre, Fashion and Accessories are always well represented at the Festival. Meet Kathy Andrews. Working with wool, she creates two and three dimensional art and sculpture by wet felting and needle felting. Inspiration for all of her art comes from the woodlands and fields in Kawartha Lakes near her studio. The importance of conservation and natural preservation is expressed through her delightful wool fibre interpretations. Her work can be found at Rails End Gallery Shop. This is Kathy's first Festival!

Minden graphic designer Natalia Brown discovered letterpress printing and fell in love with the process. When she acquired her very own 125-year-old, 700 pound, Golding Pearl printing press - lovingly named 'Chuck' it was love at first sight. Always looking to add her own sense of humour (and the occasional swear word) Natalia aka Naebr Design creates unique and quirky stationery for everyone else's life events.





There is no shortage of stunning views in the Haliburton Highlands and John Yates has experienced a vast number through his lens. Photographer John Yates made his HAC debut in 2022. His artistic eye and knack for capturing ethereal moments in the landscape have a meditative quality. 

Minden Pride Week

Fun For The Whole Family!

You won't want to miss Minden Pride Week, the big hearted, memory-making premier event for the whole family that hugged the community for the first time in 2016 and now has the community hugging back!

With a full week of super colourful, fun events starting on Monday, Aug. 21 with a flag raising ceremony and reception, culminating on Sunday, Aug. 27 with the ever-popular, highlyattended Pride River Parade and Street Fest, visitors of all ages are in for a great time.

"The day it first started was on the lawn of the Wild Swan Bed & Breakfast Inn in Minden," Allan Guinan, Minden Pride Committee Chair, said, "there were a handful of people. Now, at our flag raising at the beginning of the week, hundreds of people show up including politicians and local dignitaries."

Guinan calculated that based on all of the Pride events throughout the week (in 2019, pre-pandemic) that at least 2,000 people participated. "And now we have a street festival in combination with a Pride parade down the Gull River which attracts a lot of people for that kind of spectacle. We really do feel like we're becoming one of the larger cultural summer events in Haliburton County."

How and Why Pride Week Began

In 2016, after the tragic nightclub shooting at Pulse nightclub in Orlando and a senseless act of vandalism in Haliburton Village when a storefront was defaced with homophobic graffiti, the community came together, including high school students from the Gay/Straight Alliance to show tolerance and acceptance, and to take a stand against intimidation by celebrating their presence in the community through a festival of visible, inclusive events. At the suggestion of then Haliburton County Warden, Carol Moffatt, Founders Sinclair Russell and Bob Baynton-Smith went to Minden Hills Council for support in creating Minden Pride.

HHSS Student Pride Initiative

"I think the most significant thing that's changed," Guinan said, "is our involvement with Haliburton Highlands Secondary School which just started last year and is continuing to grow. The students decided to create a Pride Week celebrating and promoting diversity and inclusiveness, this year June 5 to 9. Last year, it culminated in a Colour Run, which is where the students run

around the track wearing white t-shirts and are bombarded with coloured powder as they run along the route. It is taken from the Indian Holi tradition and Minden Pride will be supplying rainbow colours to the high school for the event. This year we will once again be assisting with their initiative."

Guinan added, "This demonstrates that there has been a big change because I know a lot of the people who grew up in this county, queer, didn't feel that they had much support through the schools. From our perspective, this is really demonstrating that there has been a shift and a change."


Pride's Biggest Challenge

"Our biggest challenge is getting more youths to participate in our events. Many don't feel comfortable being out and open. But, now the work we're doing with the high school and the Youth Hub in Haliburton is helping to bridge that gap."

Beyond Pride



We have instances of homophobia, of people being very unhappy with what we are doing, and so from my perspective, the wish would be that there isn't a need for it."

In the meantime, over 2,000 visitors will once again be entertained for a whole week of Minden Pride which is continuing to be a beacon for the best of who we can become as a community.
